Below are the results of attempting to parse this document with an SGML parser.

- Error** *Line 23 column 33: required attribute "TYPE" not specified.*

The attribute given above is required for an element that you've used, but you have omitted it. For instance, in most HTML and XHTML document types the "type" attribute is required on the "script" element and the "alt" attribute is required for the "img" element.

Typical values for `type` are `type="text/css"` for `<style>` and `type="text/javascript"` for `<script>`.

- Error** *Line 171 column 41: there is no attribute "BORDER"*.

You have used the attribute named above in your document, but the document type you are using does not support that attribute for this element. This error is often caused by incorrect use of the "Strict" document type with a document that uses frames (e.g. you must use the "Transitional" document type to get the "target" attribute), or by using vendor proprietary extensions such as "marginheight" (this is usually fixed by using CSS to achieve the desired effect instead).

This error may also result if the element itself is not supported in the document type you are using, as an undefined element will have no supported attributes; in this case, see the element-undefined error message for further information.

How to fix: check the spelling and case of the element and attribute, (Remember XHTML is all lower-case) and/or check that they are both allowed in the chosen document type, and/or use CSS instead of this attribute. If you received this error when using the `<embed>` element to incorporate flash media in a Web page, see the [FAQ item on valid flash](#).

3. **Error** Line 171 column 47: there is no attribute "ALT".

4. **Error** Line 184 column 15: required attribute "TYPE" not specified.

5. **Error** Line 187 column 74: end tag for element "B" which is not open.

The Validator found an end tag for the above element, but that element is not currently open. This is often caused by a leftover end tag from an element that was removed during editing, or by an implicitly closed element (if you have an error related to an element being used where it is not allowed, this is almost certainly the case). In the latter case this error will disappear as soon as you fix the original problem.

If this error occurred in a script section of your document, you should probably read this [FAQ entry](#).

6. **Error** Line 187 column 161: end tag for element "STRONG" which is not open.

7. **Error** Line 187 column 167: end tag for "SCRIPT" omitted, but its declaration does not permit this.

- o you used something inside this tag that was not allowed, and the validator is complaining that the tag should be closed before such content can be allowed.

The next message, "start tag was here" points to the particular instance of the tag in question); the positional indicator points to where the validator expected you to close the tag.

9. **Error** Line 188 column 16: end tag for element "SCRIPT" which is not open.

The mentioned element is not allowed to appear in the context in which you've placed it; the other mentioned elements are the only ones that are both allowed there *and* can contain the element mentioned. This might mean that you need a containing element, or possibly that you've forgotten to close a previous element.

One possible cause for this message is that you have attempted to put a block-level element (such as "<p>" or "<table>") inside an inline element (such as "<a>", "", or "").
