- Error** *Line 14 column 28: there is no attribute "width".*

You have used the attribute named above in your document, but the document type you are using does not support that attribute for this element. This error is often caused by incorrect use of the "Strict" document type with a document that uses frames (e.g. you must use the "Transitional" document type to get the "target" attribute), or by using vendor proprietary extensions such as "marginheight" (this is usually fixed by using CSS to achieve the desired effect instead).

This error may also result if the element itself is not supported in the document type you are using, as an undefined element will have no supported attributes; in this case, see the [element-undefined](#) error message for further information.

How to fix: check the spelling and case of the element and attribute, (Remember XHTML is all lower-case) and/or check that they are both allowed in the chosen document type, and/or use CSS instead of this attribute. If you received this error when using the `<embed>` element to incorporate flash media in a Web page, see the [FAQ item on valid flash](#).

- Error** *Line 21 column 10: an attribute value specification must be an attribute value literal unless SHORTTAG YES is specified.*

- Error** *Line 24 column 45: document type does not allow element "td" here.*

The element named above was found in a context where it is not allowed. This could mean that you have incorrectly nested elements -- such as a "style" element in the "body" section instead of inside "head" -- or two elements that overlap (which is not allowed).

One common cause for this error is the use of XHTML syntax in HTML documents. Due to HTML's rules of implicitly closed elements, this error can create cascading effects. For instance, using XHTML's "self-closing" tags for "meta" and "link" in the "head" section of a HTML document may cause the parser to infer the end of the "head" section and

the beginning of the "body" section (where "link" and "meta" are not allowed; hence the reported error).

4. **Error** Line 30 column 27: literal is missing closing delimiter.

Did you forget to close a (double) quote mark?

5. **Error** Line 30 column 37: end tag for "img" omitted, but OMITTAG NO was specified.

You may have neglected to close an element, or perhaps you meant to "self-close" an element, that is, ending it with "/>" instead of ">".

6. **Info** Line 29 column 22: start tag was here.

8. **Error** Line 37 column 37: end tag for "img" omitted, but OMITTAG NO was specified.

24. **Error** Line 115 column 34: required attribute "alt" not specified.

The attribute given above is required for an element that you've used, but you have omitted it. For instance, in most HTML and XHTML document types the "type" attribute is required on the "script" element and the "alt" attribute is required for the "img" element.

Typical values for type are type="text/css" for <style> and type="text/javascript" for <script>.

25. **Error** Line 424 column 52: document type does not allow element "script" here; missing one of "th", "td" start-tag.

The mentioned element is not allowed to appear in the context in which you've placed it; the other mentioned elements are the only ones that are both allowed there *and* can contain the element mentioned. This might mean that you need a containing element, or possibly that you've forgotten to close a previous element.

One possible cause for this message is that you have attempted to put a block-level element (such as "<p>" or "<table>") inside an inline element (such as "<a>", "", or "").

26. **Error** Line 431 column 104: document type does not allow element "script" here; missing one of "th", "td" start-tag.

29. **Info** Line 431 column 124: start tag was here.

34. **Error** Line 444 column 18: end tag for element "td" which is not open.

The Validator found an end tag for the above element, but that element is not currently open. This is often caused by a leftover end tag from an element that was removed during editing, or by an implicitly closed element (if you have an error related to an element being used where it is not allowed, this is almost certainly the case). In the latter case this error will disappear as soon as you fix the original problem.

If this error occurred in a script section of your document, you should probably read this [FAQ entry](#).

35. **Error** Line 445 column 16: end tag for element "tr" which is not open.
